Immerse yourself in the beautiful setting of the Narragansett Bay Research Reserve to learn and witness first-hand the impacts of climate change and rising sea levels on salt marshes. Hear about current research and monitoring projects and return to your classroom with local data to share this story with your students. This workshop is designed for middle and high school science teachers. To promote outdoor learning at school through research, monitoring or stewardship, participants will receive \$500 to develop a project of their choice.
